



Cleaning instructions

Laminate can be cleaned with a soft cloth wrung in a mild solution of lukewarm water and a universal cleaning detergent. After cleaning, wipe with a soft dry cloth.

Outdoor furniture


It is recommended to wipe all surfaces that may come into contact with rain, snowfall or foreign liquids as this can risk long term damage if left in direct sunlight. Leaving objects on the surface for extended periods of time in direct sunlight may also cause discolouration.

Always store in a dry, ventilated location that is not in direct sunlight.

Please follow steps 1 – 3 to assemble the RFH Terrace Table


Step 1 / 3

Turn the table top packaging over so that the box branding is facing downwards. This will ensure that the mounting holes are facing upwards.



Step 2 / 3

Align the holes and fix the three screws into each leg by turning clockwise with the Allen key provided to secure the table leg.



Step 3 / 3

The table can now be turned and is ready for use.
